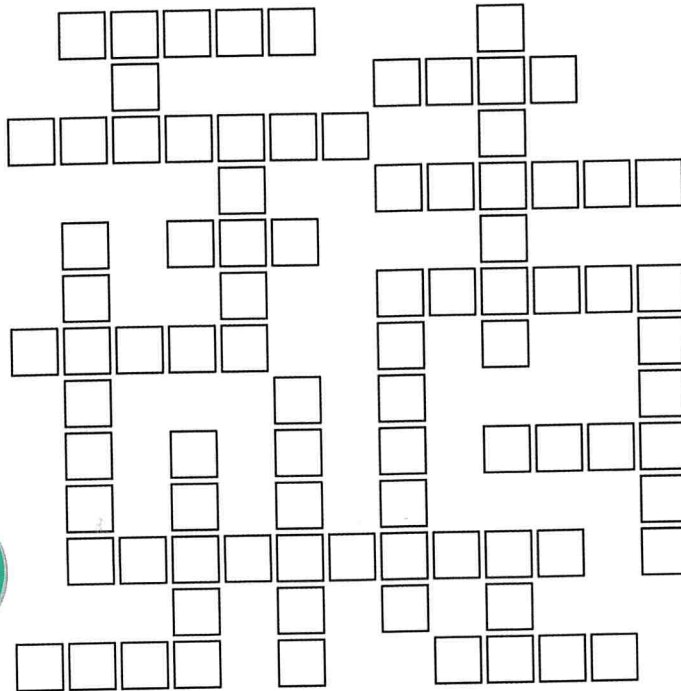

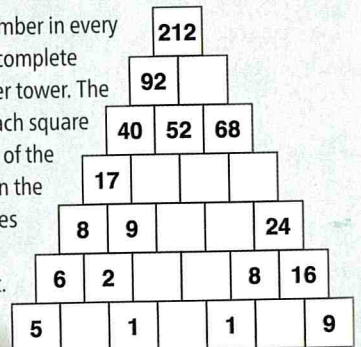

Place a number in every square to complete the number tower. The value in each square is the sum of the numbers in the two squares directly beneath it.

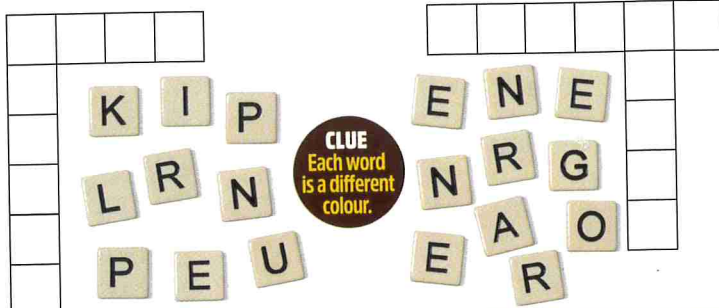
