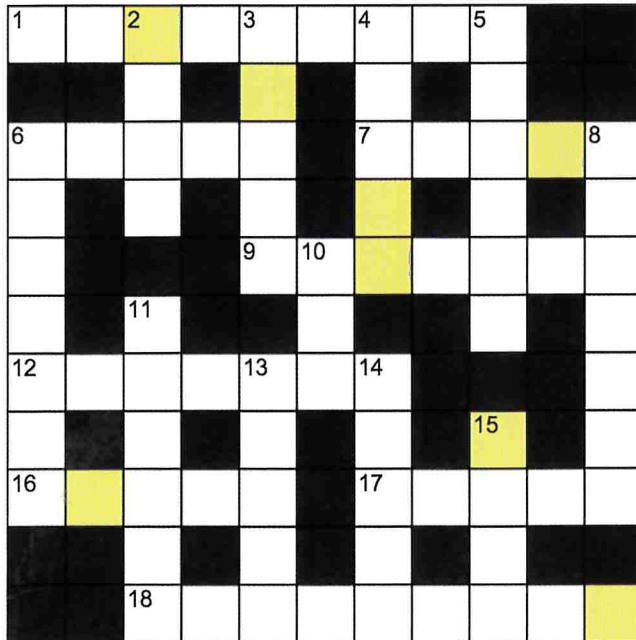

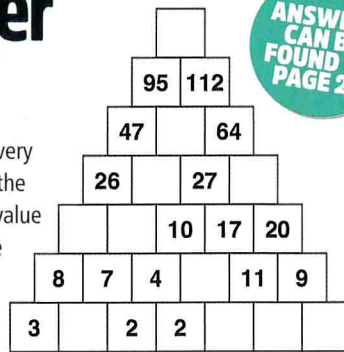

Number tower

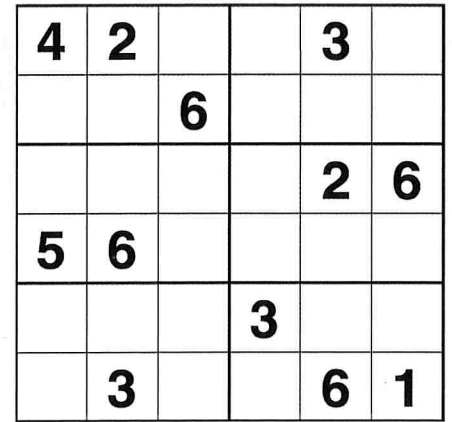
Place a number in every square to complete the number tower. The value in each square is the sum of the numbers in the two squares directly below it.

These two pictures of a quidditch player might appear identical at first, but take another look. Can you spot the five fiendishly hard-to-find differences?



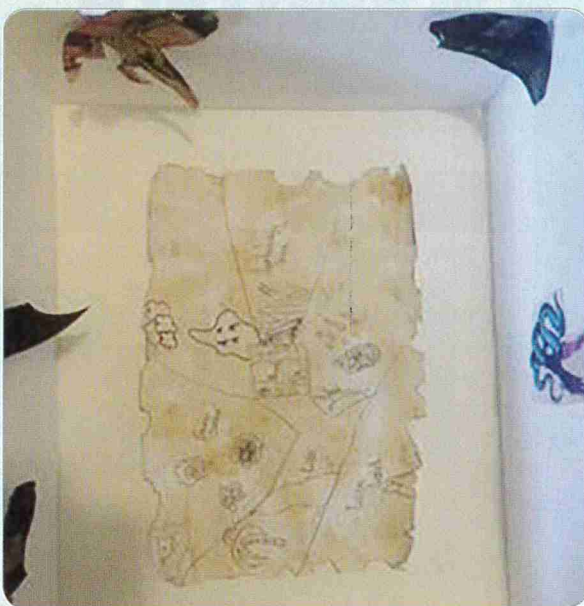
